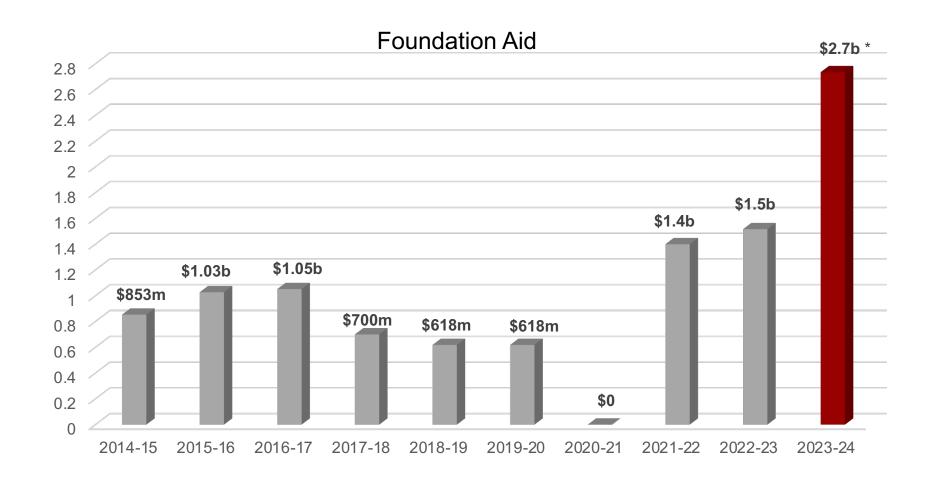

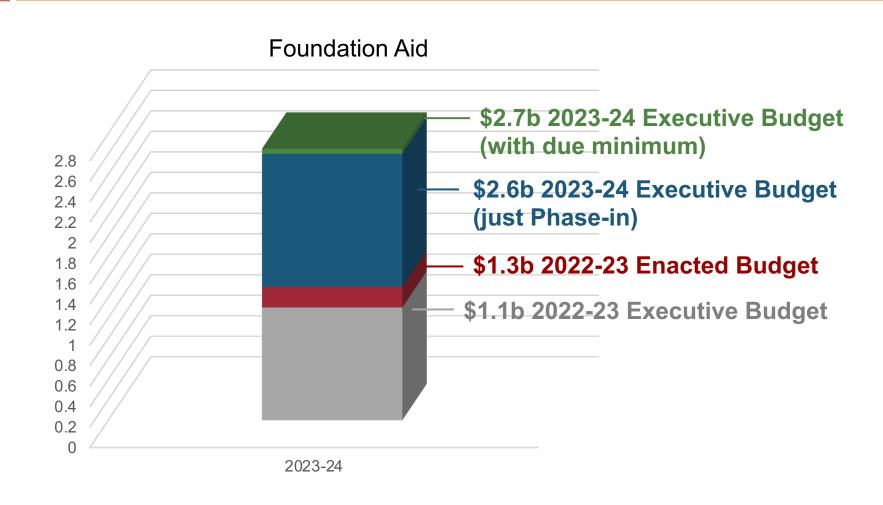

Actual Foundation Increases and Projected Increase

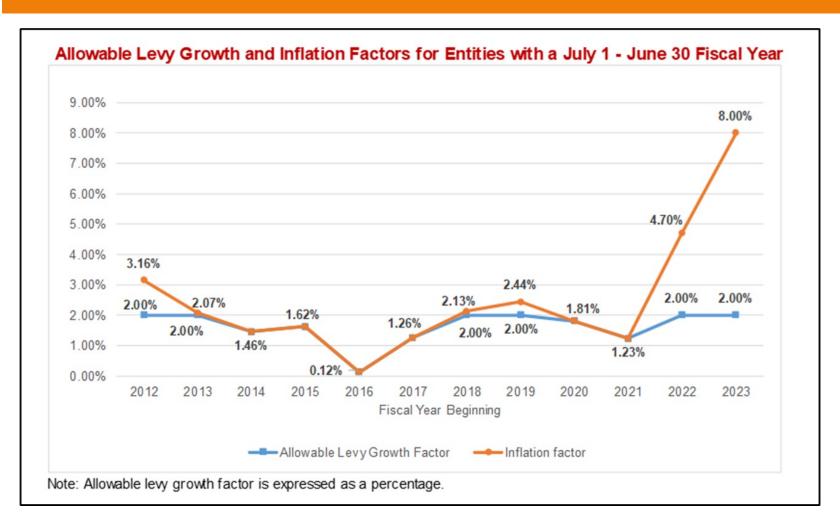

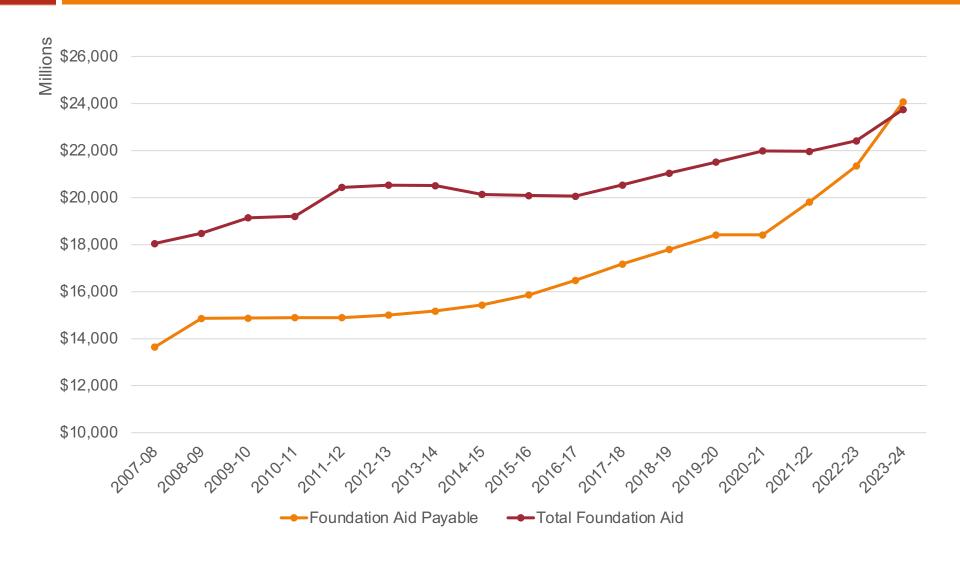
Proposed 2023-24 Foundation Aid Increase

Proposed Foundation Aid Set-aside for High-Impact Tutoring

A district is subject to the High-Impact Tutoring requirement for the 2023-24 school year if:

23-24 Foundation Aid Increase is > 3%
And

23-24 Foundation Aid Increase is > \$100,000

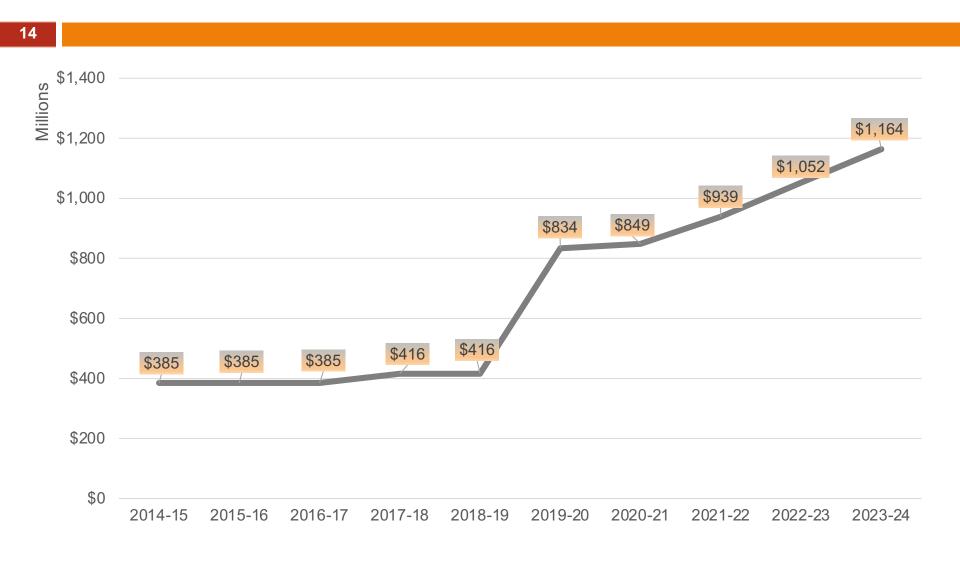
- ✓ Amount of set-aside would be greater of \$100,000 or 11.77% of the increase above 3%.
- ✓ This set-aside would be for 2023-24 only.

High-Impact Tutoring Set-aside continued

Each school shall use such high-impact tutoring set-aside amount to:

- Deliver small group or individual tutoring sessions in reading and mathematics to students in grades three through eight designated by each school district as at risk of falling below state standards.
- Such services and sessions may be provided during the school day, before or after school, or on the weekend and must occur no less than twice per week for no less than thirty minutes until the student is no longer designated as at risk.
- The funds set aside under this section <u>shall only be used to</u>
 <u>supplement</u> current federal, state and local funding and <u>in no case</u>
 <u>shall supplant</u> current district expenditures of federal, state or local funds on high-impact tutoring.

Other Proposals

\$20 million grant program is to support the development of new early college high school and P-TECH programs.

\$10 million over two years in competitive funding for school districts, BOCES, and community colleges to work with local industry to create a robust high school-collegeworkforce pipeline.

Proposed Reporting Requirements

- New Prekindergarten Reporting all school districts eligible for Pre-K funding would be required to report various Pre-K student counts annually to SED by September 1st.
- The Executive Budget proposal would extend the requirement for districts to submit building level financial transparency reports to the state annually for an additional five years, until June 30, 2028.

New Zero-Emission School Bus Reporting

School districts would be required to annually submit to SED a progress report on the implementation of zero-emission school buses including:

- Capacity of the electrical grid to meet needs
- Number of charging stations and other components
- Workforce training to date
- Number and proportion of zero-emission buses currently purchased, leased or utilized
- Number of zero-emission buses anticipated in the next two years
- Number and proportion of zero-emission buses utilized by contractors providing transportation services
- Number and proportion of zero-emission buses anticipated to be utilized by contractors in the next two years

Additional Proposals

\$2.5 million for SED to study and design a new rate-setting methodology for special education tuition rate-setting to streamline and improve the timeliness of tuition rates for providers

- Extend Retiree Income Waiver
 - Would allow public sector retirees to work for a school and/or BOCES without any income limit or impact on their current retirement benefits
 - If approved would be in effect until 6/30/24

Database Freeze and PYA

- Proposal to freeze maximum aid payment to what is included in the November database
- Proposal to eliminate prior year claims made for payments prior to the 2022-23 school year to no later than 6/30/23
- Proposal for prior year claims made in 2022-23 school year and thereafter may not be certified on claims made later than November 1st of that school year

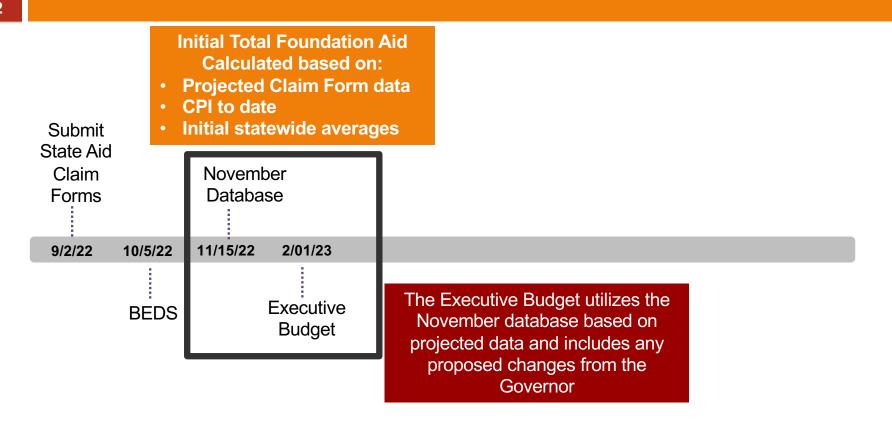

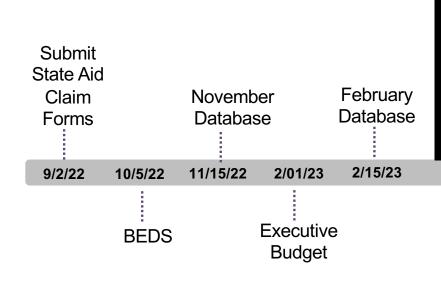

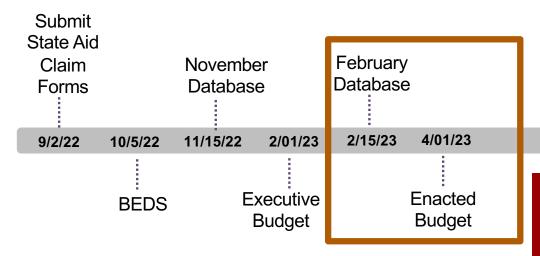
2023-24 Total Foundation Aid Calculation Cycle

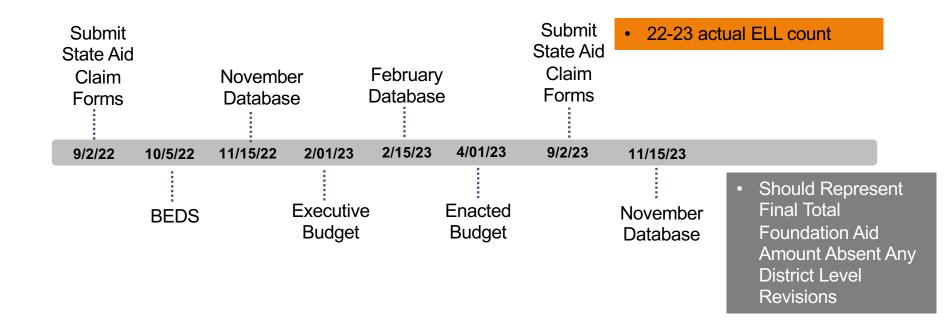
2023-24 Total Foundation Aid Calculation Cycle

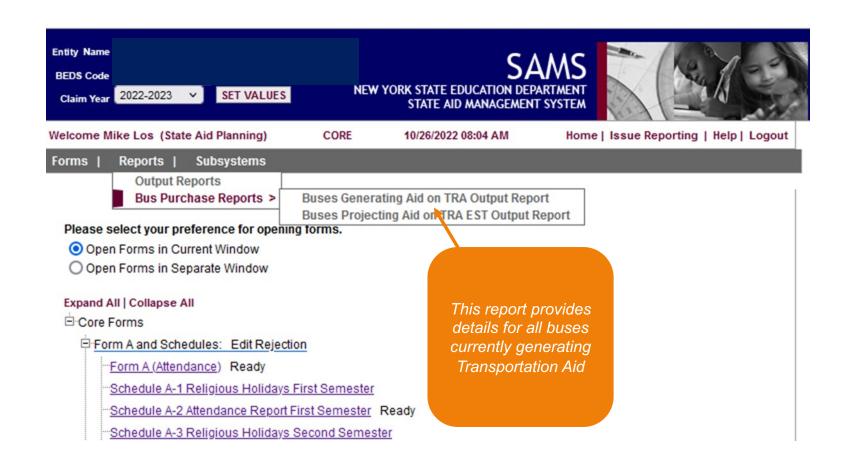

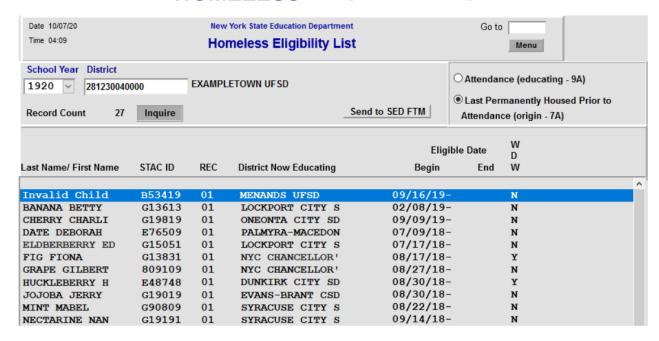

Transportation Aid Penalty Waivers

- Section 10 of part A of Chapter 56 of the Laws of 2022 added a new subdivision 5 to Section 3625 of Education Law. This amendment authorized forgiveness of certain Transportation Aid penalties due to late filed or late executed contracts, and the failure to advertise for contracts for transportation after July 1, 2012.
- SED has begun reaching out to districts that are potentially eligible for this forgiveness process. Affected districts were notified on January 10th of the potential penalties that may be eligible to be forgiven for their district and the steps necessary to request forgiveness of these penalties. This process will be done through the SED Monitoring and Vendor Performance System under Transportation within the Business Portal and under the access of the Superintendent. Penalties forgiven will be added to the prior year claims list.

Building Aid Late Final Cost Report Penalty Forgiveness

Section 9 of Part A of Chapter 56 of the Laws of 2022 amends Education Law §3602(6)(k) relating to building aid penalties due to delinquent submission of final cost reports by school districts, where such penalty was recouped by the state after July 1, 2013. The law provides the Commissioner the authority to consider these expenses as valid and eligible for aid under certain conditions. We have reviewed our records, identified relevant penalties, and will be notifying all district superintendents via email in the near future (example of the <u>penalty email</u> and <u>no penalty email</u>). If you believe the information in this notification is in error, please contact us by <u>email</u>.

Penalties considered by the Department to be valid for forgiveness after the last scheduled aid payment in the year in which the penalty was taken will be placed on the prior year claims list, as required by Education Law §3604(5). Funds appropriated for the prior year claims list are provided sequentially, in the order that it has been approved for payment by the commissioner. The 2022-23 enacted state budget was the second year in which no funding was provided to satisfy new or existing claims on this list. The 2023-24 executive budget proposal does not include funding to satisfy these claims.

Suggestions fr



Meal and Meal Quality Improvement – offer a wider variety of fresh local fruits and vegetables; offer entrée items that may otherwise be cost-prohibited like higher quality cuts of meat



Service and Atmosphere – invest in marketing materials like digital signage and banners; upgrade the hardware of your POS system; redesign and purchase new serving lines that keep food hotter or colder and allows for better merchandising



Staffing – hire additional food service staff to expand menu offerings and do more scratch cooking; increase staff wages or offer bonus/incentives to staff if wage increases are not sustainable; hire a maintenance technician and/or custodian for food service



Equipment – replace small equipment and small wares; replace big kitchen equipment and upgrade for efficiency, for example purchasing a combi oven; increase storage capacity by adding refrigerator/freezer units; invest in reusable trays; buy a salad bar or refrigerated buffet table; purchase equipment to offer alternative and innovative meal deliver models like Breakfast in the Classroom or Grab and Go Breakfast



Staff Training and Professional Development – Offer a training for your management-level staff; provide additional training and professional development for staff as it relates to improving the food service program and to meet professional standards requirements.



Fund Paid Meals- nonprofit food service account funds can be used to fund paid breakfast meals and for the 22-23 SY only, fund paid lunch meals

Facilities Planning Updates — Federal Grants funding Capital Projects

RE: Deadline for Submission of Federal Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) Funded Construction Projects

To allow for sufficient time for construction projects funded with federal ESSER funds to be fully obligated and liquidated by federal deadlines, please be advised that:

- all new ESSER II (Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations -CRRSA) funded construction projects must be submitted to NYSED's <u>Office of</u> <u>Facilities Planning</u> prior to **March 1, 2023**; and
- all new American Rescue Plan (ARP)-ESSER funded construction projects must be submitted to NYSED's Office of Facilities Planning prior to October 1, 2023.

Federally Funded Capital Projects

- CRRSA Federally Funded Projects must be encumbered by September 2023 and liquidated by October 2023.
- ARP Federally Funded Projects must be encumbered by September 2024 and liquidated by October 2024.
- Federal Stimulus funded capital construction projects must <u>not</u> proceed until the projects receive approval from <u>both</u> the Office of Federal Funds and Office of Facilities Planning.

All SED Submission Paperwork

- The Office of Facilities Planning is requesting PDFs of SED paperwork for all final project submissions to be emailed to emscfp@nysed.gov, in addition to the paper copy that must be mailed in.
- The review number will be assigned upon receipt of the paper submission.
- Please scan all SED paperwork as double-sided.
- For a submission that includes multiple project numbers submitted as a single package, please create a separate PDF for each individual project number that contains the SED paperwork for that project.
- Paperwork should be scanned and submitted in the order listed on the SED FP-CL form for each project number.

All SED Submission Paperwork

- Use the subject "<District name> SED Paperwork"; please note the SED project number should no longer be included in the subject line.
- The body of the email message should include all SED project numbers associated with the submission.
- Use the full 15-digit SED Project Number (i.e., SED Project #XX-XX-XX-XX-XXX).
- All SED project numbers are required so that they can pull the appropriate project folders.

Certificates of Occupancy

- Occupying or using any buildings without first getting a valid Certificate of Occupancy (C.O.) is not only illegal but is potentially dangerous to the occupants.
- It also places substantial liability on the district, the Superintendent and the Board of Education. In fact, the Superintendent of Schools could lose his/her credentials and the members of the Board of Education could be held personally liable under such circumstances.

Conclusions

- We recommend reviewing the calculations used in the Executive Budget before finalizing your own district's budget for State Aid.
- □ The State Budget is due April 1, 2023 and will use the 2/15/23 database.
- Remember that Foundation Aid amounts may be adjusted for revised student counts and CPI amounts.
