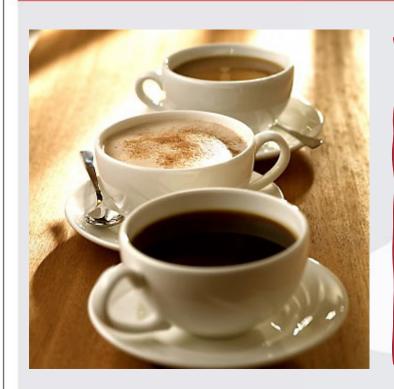

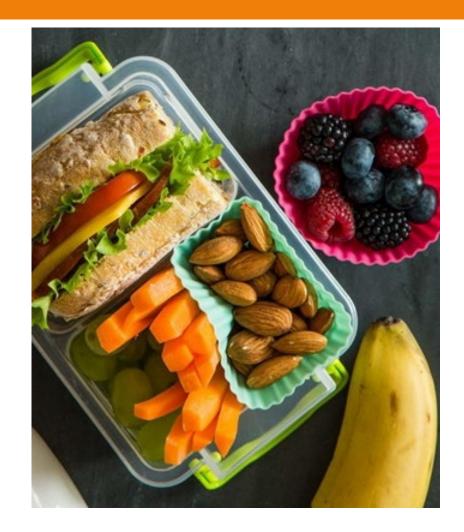

Chargeback Fringes to Food Service and/or Special Aid Funds

- Now is the time to review your Food Service Fund and/or Special Aid Fund to ensure:
- Food Service Fund:
 - All fringes for the Food Service staff have been accounted for in the Food Service Fund.
 - ERS, FICA, Health, Dental, Life, etc.
 - Even if Fund is operating at a deficit, should record all related direct expenses in (C).
 - Offset loss with an Interfund Transfer from General vs. reporting some or all of fringes in (A).



Chargeback Fringes to Food Service and/or Special Aid Funds

Special Aid Fund:

Ensure all fringes budgeted in FS-10s for the various grants in the Special Aid Fund have been accounted for there.

- Grant applications aren't required to include fringes, but if did, make sure fringes have been charged during the year.
 - Doing at year-end can really swing Unappropriated Fund Balance in (A).
 - Don't wait until end of grant period. Fringes should be charged during same period that wages were charged.
 - Example: If Title I grant is for salaries between 9/1/20 and 6/30/21, charge budgeted fringes by 6/30/21 vs. at 8/31/21.



Review Appropriations Status Report

As we discussed previously:

Boards of education are constrained by Education Law, Section 1718, and may not "... incur a district liability in excess of the amount appropriated by a district meeting..." This law is also enforced by the State Comptroller, who, in the Uniform System of Accounts, states that, "An appropriation must be available before an expenditure is charged."

170.2 (1) of the Commissioner's Regulation grants the board of education the authority through the following provision:

"To make transfers between and within functional unit appropriations for teachers' salaries and ordinary contingent expenditures, boards of education may, by resolution, authorize the chief school officer to make transfers within limits established by the board."

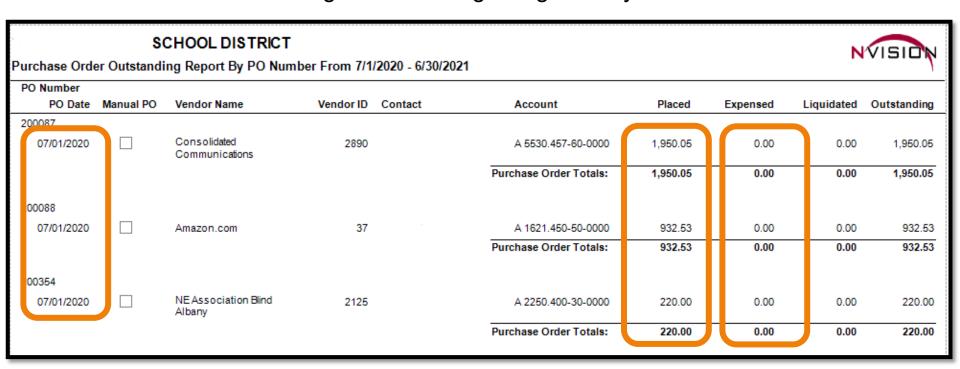

 Commissioner's Approval Date (CAD) if Final
 Cost Report (FCR), Certificate of Substantial
 Completion (CSC) and SA-139 have all been filed
 timely (Chapter 97 projects)
- Review your open projects to see if any can be completed by 6/30:
 - Don't wait until 6/30, if possible
 - Give them time to review and process

Check Capital Outlay Exception Projects, Early Aid Starts and Pre-Chapter 97 Projects

- These projects had their Building Aid start in advance of FCR/CSC
- They still have formal due dates
- If due dates missed, all Building Aid paid may be recouped

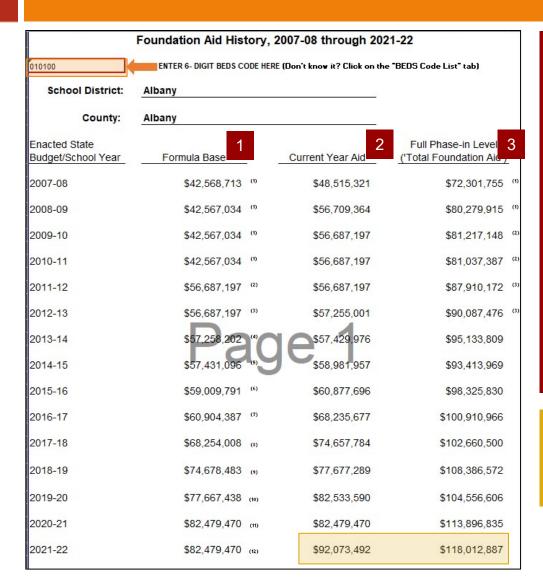
Foundation Aid History

- The final topic of discussion for today is the Foundation Aid History Worksheet.
- Foundation Aid was instituted in 2007-08 with the intention that it would be fully phased-in after three years.
- We still have many districts that are not fully phased-in after 15 years of Foundation Aid.
- This worksheet will help you determine the Foundation Aid funding level for your district.

- Formula Base Prior Year Foundation Aid Paid.
- Current Year Aid the District's Projected Foundation Aid.
- 3. Full Phase-in Level represent "Total Foundation Aid", i.e., the calculated amount per the aid formula.

If the amount in Column 3 is greater than Columns 2, the District is underfunded.

State Aid Worksheets: Conclusion

- The Excel worksheets are set up so that upon entering your BEDS Code, it will auto-populate.
- The worksheets are protected to prevent erasure of the formulas and the source data.
- We show trends over five years but have complied data going back to 2007-08.
 - If you need more data, we can unlock it for you.
