The Process of Claiming Aid for Homeless Youth

Special Education Aid Assistance Service

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Intake Process



Student and/or family come to register with the district



Housing questionnaire is filled out



Reviewed by the registrar

If housing questionnaire indicates the student/family is homeless

- Fill out the STAC 202 form
- Notify the district homeless liaison
- Send filled out 202 to homeless liaison

Intake

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Homeless Liaison may want to meet with the student and/or family to gather more information

Determine if the student has a disability (classified)

Refer and notify the Special Education Department

Notify the Business Office of homeless status

- Arrange for transportation

Each building administrator (Principal) should also be notified of student's homeless status



Homeless students

STAC Eligible

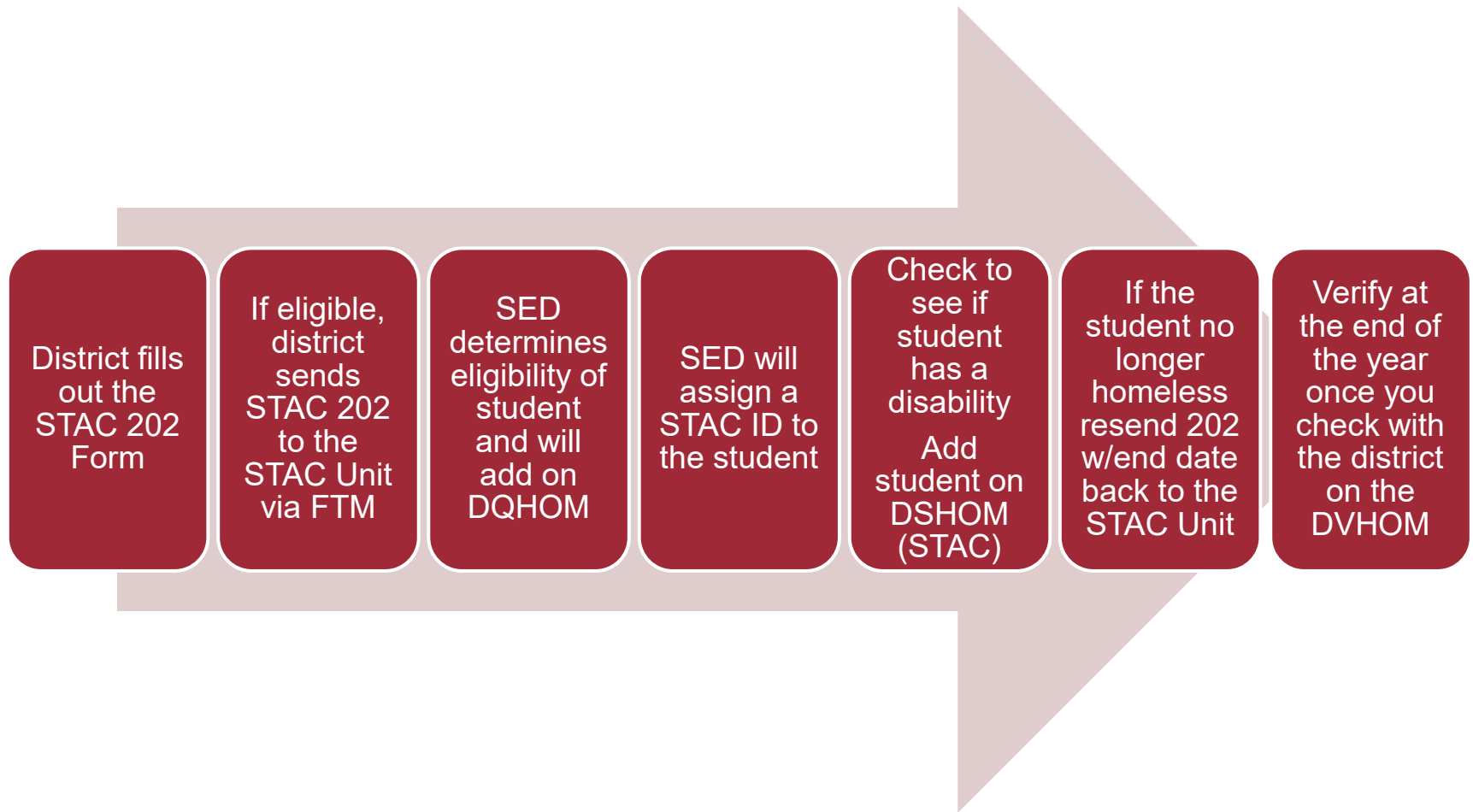
- A student that loses permanent housing in one district and begins to attend a different district in NYS
- The student will be living in Temporary Housing
 - Living w/ another family (Doubled Up)
 - Hotel/Motel

Not STAC Eligible

- A student that loses permanent housing and continues to attend their district of origin (home district)
- A student that comes from a different state or country

STAC Process

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Rates & Reimbursement

Reimbursement is at 100% for SY, there are no homeless summer STACs

If Provider is the District

- The rate is set by STAC based on the district's nonresident tuition rate
- Homeless Codes:
 - 8500K (Reg K-6)
 - 8500L (Reg 7-12)
 - 8501K (Special Ed K-6)
 - 8501L (Special Ed 7-12)

If Provider is a Private Placement

- The rate is set by STAC

If Provider is a BOCES

- We can enter the BOCES cost for the student, even if below district threshold

Homeless Process

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STAC REIMBURSEMENT APPROVAL

- While the student remains homeless in the district of current attendance, records must be added using the DSHOM
- Approval Requests can be viewed on DQAPP

EDUCATION VERIFICATION

- District of Current Attendance verifies the Education Online using the DVHOM Screen

Homeless Process

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END OF HOMELESS ELIGIBILITY

- District of Current Attendance should submit the original STAC-202 form with end date to the STAC Unit when:
 - student has found permanent housing
 - student has graduated
 - student has exited the district
- District can view updated STAC-202 data on DQHOM
- Upload 202 with end date to SED FTM and email OMSSTAC@nysed.gov

- ❑ Who is reviewing and monitoring the eligibility list?

- ❑ Who is monitoring the STAC records online?
- ❑ Who is verifying the placement/program?
- ❑ Who is monitoring payments and chargebacks?

STAC Forms

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□ STAC-202

- SED only uses the STAC-202 forms for reimbursement purposes each year
 - School districts use the STAC-202 form to collect data on students who have been identified as homeless. Completed STAC forms help districts report on such things as the number of students who are homeless in the school district.

Statute of Limitation for Claiming Homeless Aid

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- ❑ 2022-23 school year STACs need to be verified by **June 30, 2024**
- ❑ December 2023 the final Non-Resident Tuition Rates (NRT Rates) were set for the 22-23 School Year
- ❑ **January 15, 2024** Homeless Aid March Payment Deadline
 - ❑ NRT rate x Homeless FTE count
- ❑ If not STAC'd timely, Aid will be delayed

Homeless Best Practices

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- Encouraged to send a copy of STAC-202 to the district that is fiscally responsible
 - ▣ Treat them as you would like to be treated
- Verify all children the district is being charged for, were actual district residents *(are these truly your students?)*
 - ▣ DQCDI Report
- Follow up on your homeless children being charged against you
 - ▣ When obtained permanent housing?
 - ▣ Inform Business Office of status
 - Budget implications
 - ▣ The fiscally responsible district

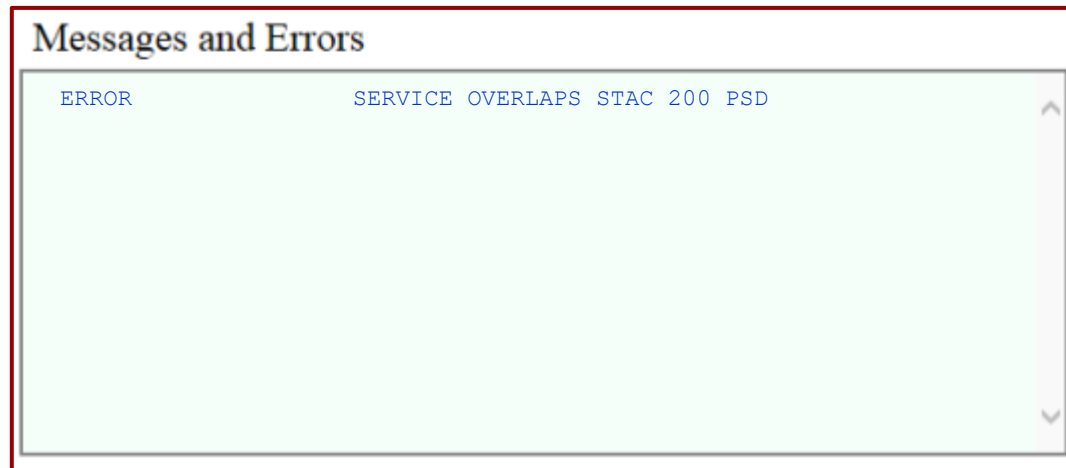
