Public Placements

Definition:

Aid for resident students with disabilities served in a public school or BOCES program, for whom the annualized cost exceeds 3 times the district's AOE/TAPU (PUB output report – line 5)

Formula:

Annual program cost - (3 x AOE/TAPU) x Aid Ratio x FTE

Aid Claim Process & Facts:

Aid is paid year following students' enrollment (up to 25% in December (approved costs), additional 45% in March (approved costs), additional 15% in June (approved costs), additional 15% in August (verified costs), remaining balance if any in September (verified costs)

Statute of Limitations:

Two years – (one year for 'current year' aid)

Definition:

Private Excess Cost Aid payable for students with disabilities placed in approved in-state and out-of-state private schools

- Day and Residential, Rome and Batavia, Special Act Union Free School Districts
- Districts must submit out-of-state packet including application to Non-District Unit for approval:
 school-age-initial-application 0.docx (live.com)

Formula:

(SED Approved Tuition Rate - Basic Contribution) x Aid Ratio x FTE

Aid Claim Process & Facts:

- Education Rates set by NYS Education Department's Rate Setting Unit
- Maintenance Rates set by NYS Office of Children & Family Services
- Aid is paid the year following students' enrollment (up to 25% in December (approved costs), additional 45% in March (approved costs), additional 15% in June (approved costs), additional 15% in August (verified costs), remaining balance if any in September (verified costs)
- County Social Services pays provider for 10-month maintenance costs and then bills the school district of residence
 56.848% of maintenance costs
 - The 2020-21 Enacted Budget eliminated the 18.424% state share reimbursement for the maintenance costs of SWDs pursuant to Education Law §4405 in residential schools outside of NYC (increased from 38.424% to 56.848%).

- Required for all 10-month private placements on an annual basis
 - Day In-State / Day Out-of-State
 - Residential In-State / Residential Out-of-State

- Required for the following instances:
 - Change in placement type
 - Day / Residential
 - In-State / Out-of-State
 - Change in CSE
 - Change from preschool to school age

Summer 4408 Placements

Definition:

School-age students (public and private) with disabilities educated during July and August

Formula:

Reimbursed at 80% of the <u>approved</u> cost of education, maintenance and transportation

Exception: Chapters 47, 66 and 721 are reimbursed at 100% of the approved cost

Aid Claim Process & Facts:

- Education Rates set by NYS Education Department's Rate Setting Unit
- Maintenance Rates set by NYS Office of Children & Family Services
- Current year placements receive a maximum of 56% aid in current State fiscal year (first payment issued in March)

Statute of Limitations:

Three years

Summer Placements RSO & SDI

Definition:

School-age students with disabilities educated during July and August receiving related services and/or specially designed instruction.

Program Key:

- 9015A: Related Services Only (RSO)
- 9015B: Specially Designed Instruction Only (SDI)
- 9015C: Specialized Instruction with Related Services (SIWRS)
- 9015D: Home or Hospital Instruction (HHI)

Formula:

Reimbursed at 80% of the approved cost

Aid Claim Process & Facts:

- Education Rates set by NYS Education Department's Rate Setting Unit
 - https://www.oms.nysed.gov/rsu/Rates_Methodology/MethodLetters/home.html
- Current year placements receive a maximum of 56% aid in current State fiscal year (first payment issued in March)

Statute of Limitations:

Three years

Summer School Questions to Ask

- Are all STACs complete (and verified) prior to mid-February?
- Are 1:1 aides claimed and reflected in IEP?
- Have any rates <u>not been</u> established yet?
- Do you have information ready to complete supplemental Schedules SS10-SS16?
 - (District-operated 4408 programs only)
- Does the total transportation STAC amount claimed match ST-3 (5598)?
 - All eligible costs claimed?
 - Aides/Monitors on bus?

Non-Resident Students

Homeless Placements

- Identify Student & Submit STAC 202
- Determine Eligibility on DQHOM
- File Appropriate STAC
 - Monitor and Update (as needed)
- Verify STAC
 - Receive Aid

Homeless Placements

Definition:

Only <u>non-resident</u> homeless students from another district in NYS who have designated your district as their educating district are eligible for state aid reimbursement through the STAC online system. Applies to regular education students or students with disabilities.

Formula:

Aid is paid at 100% of approved tuition cost (based on NRT rate or out of district program costs).

Aid Claim Process & Facts:

- No ESY Homeless STACs
- Aid is paid year following students' enrollment
- Transportation costs are reported on the ST-3
- District of origin is responsible for the basic contribution which is deducted from state aid
 - Last residence before the student became homeless

Statute of Limitations:

One Year

Questions to Ask

- Who is filing the STAC 202 and STAC approval?
- Who is communicating with previous school district?
- Who is monitoring the STACs and eligibility?
- Who is verifying the placement?
- Who is monitoring payment?

4201 State-Supported Placements

Definition:

Designated for children who are deaf or may have visual impairment, orthopedic impairment or may have multiple disabilities.

Formula:

10-Month: District of residence pays 4201 school; reimbursed tuition less basic contribution

- APR1 June before end of school year (Sept. Dec. less basic contribution)
- APR2 by March 31 of following school year (Full year tuition less basic contribution and APR1)

2-Month: Tuition paid by NYS; chargeback district of current location 20% for education and maintenance; 80% aid for transportation costs.

Aid Claim Process & Facts:

- PHC-10 Completed by School District and 4201 School and Approved by Non-District Unit
- Application Completed by School District and 4201 School and Approved by Non-District Unit
- Separate STAC-1's submitted to Non-District Unit for Summer and 10-Month
- Verify students' placement and enrollment dates
 - Between 1/1 and 6/1 of current year for 4-month (Sept. Dec.)
 - Between 7/1 and 12/1 of following year for 10-month (Sept. June)
 - Transportation costs for ESY only (after summer school is complete)

Statute of Limitations:

Verification deadlines above

State-Operated Placements

NYS School for the Deaf at Rome

NYS School for the Blind at Batavia

State-Operated Placements

Definition:

NYS School for the Deaf at Rome, NYS School for the Blind at Batavia

Formula:

10-Month: District of Origin (District at time of Admission to Care) is responsible

- 7 months of education cost (9/1-3/31) is deducted from March Spring advance
- Remainder of 10-month education cost is deducted from June General State Aid payment
- District receives private excess cost aid in following aid year

2-Month: District of Current Location (where parents are residing on July 1)

- Receives a 20% summer 4408 chargeback for education and maintenance costs in following school year (Usually collected two years after program ends)
- District receives 80% aid for summer transportation for those transportation costs verified on the online transportation verification screen (DVST3)

Aid Claim Process & Facts:

- PHC-10 application submitted to Non-District Unit by parent or district for approval for school to evaluate
- Ensure STAC is filed (STAC Unit enters initial record, reapplications completed by State Operated school)
- Verification is completed by State Operated School
- District of current location verifies summer transportation costs

Chapter Placements

OPWDD - Chapter 47, 66 & 721



Chapter Placements

Definition:

Designated for children who are in care of Office of Persons with Developmental Disabilities facility.

Formula:

10-Month: current year 70% cash advance paid in March based on prior year's STACs. 30% balance aided on APR's run in following aid year

Ch. 47 – admitted to family care from developmental center

100% tuition reimbursement

Ch. 66 - residing at developmental center

100% tuition reimbursement

Ch. 721 – Intermediate Care Facility (ICF) or Individual Residential Alternative (IRA)

 Facility CSE district reimbursed 100% of tuition, transportation, administrative expense (5% limit), and any extraordinary CSE costs

2-Month: 100% tuition reimbursement. 100% transportation reimbursement for Ch. 47 & 721. (Ch. 66 paid by developmental center)

Aid Claim Process & Facts:

- STAC Unit must receive STAC-200 form prior to STAC being filed (completed by OPWDD facility)
- File STAC
- District of origin is responsible for the basic contribution

Statute of Limitations:

One Year

Children's Residential Project (CRP)

Definition:

Interagency residential program for children with developmental disabilities.

Formula:

Education tuition is billed directly to district by provider

- CSE District reimbursed 100% of cost in following March APR issued (under Chapter Cert)
- 10-month basic contribution amount chargeback taken following year from CSE District
- Maintenance paid by OPWDD Medicaid program

Aid Claim Process & Facts:

- Parental consent for placement at ICF (Intermediate Care Facility)
- SED and OPWDD approval that student meets eligibility criteria
- Initial Application and STAC-1's need to be submitted (STAC Unit adds initial record, district adds reapplication records under private placements)

Statute of Limitations:

Two years – (one year for 'current year' aid)
